## 5. HOLD EVERYTHING

**Tallon Marine** of New Zealand ([www.tallonmarine.com](http://www.tallonmarine.com)) has come up with a modular system that's ideal for mounting purposes and for swapping out a wide range of accessories—after all, you don't need to bring the same doodads along on each and every trip. It's based on two sockets: One is wired for 12-volt DC, the other doesn't have any power capabilities. Both come in either stainless-steel or polycarbonate configurations. The powered receiver can accept a chart table lamp, anchor light, or courtesy light. The non-powered version has holders for twin champagne flutes, wine bottles, dive tanks, rodholders, cupholders, and various hooks and eyes. Load them up as you see fit.
